Deniz's message:

Deniz is away so some thoughts for you:

Recently we have sung a few songs that use the word *adore* and they always speak deeply to me. Why, I wonder. Certainly, I love God and have considered myself a Christian for many years now. Undoubtedly, I love to worship in song, especially in a congregational setting. Indeed, I love to lift my heart to God when I'm out riding my bike. But this word *adore* gets me every time.

There is something so rich and expressive when I sing it and my heart seems to reach right out to God when I do. I am so glad when it appears in songs other than Christmas carols, although they have always been the start of it for me with this word.

Funnily enough, you won't find it in Bible translations. The closest Hebrew word is *shachah* which means to bow down, or fall flat on your face and describes a physical posture of absolute submission and reverence before God. The closest Greek word is *proskuneo* which means to prostrate oneself, or to do reverence and denotes profound love, awe and submission to divine royalty. I guess this is what is going on in my heart as I sing it, from *Oh come, let us adore him* in a Christmas carol to the same sentiment in our modern-day choruses.

What an honour, to **adore** our God and king.
