A friend of mine who was born and raised in a Muslim family told me that he used to have a recurring dream when he was a young boy. He lived in a rural area with his family and knew many shepherds.

In his recurring dream there was a particular shepherd who looked after a flock of sheep. The shepherd was very kind and loving, unlike anyone my friend had met. Years later my friend moved to the UK and heard about Jesus. He heard about Jesus' love for us, his death and his resurrection. He immediately knew the shepherd in the recurring dream of his childhood was Jesus.

A time to pray for our nation and the next prime minister

Dear Deniz Carey,

I was on Esther Higham's breakfast show yesterday, discussing the resignation of Sir Keir Starmer and what might follow.

I made the point that in a time of transition and unrest, the nation needs a prime minister committed to substance over soundbites. Charisma is an insufficient leadership quality for the task that is at hand. We have seen civil unrest across the four nations, individuals struggling to pay their energy bills and families concerned about providing for those dependent on them with insecure work.

We need a leadership style focused on reconnecting with the British public and restoring good governance to our politics and policy decisions.

We will soon have our seventh prime minister in ten years and so we are encouraging churches across the four nations to [pray during this transition of leadership](#) of both the Labour Party and our nation. In a time of instability, it is important the church and Christians look to Jesus who rules the nations (Psalm 2) and discern in prayer how He requires churches in different communities to love their neighbour and act as a moral compass for the future direction of this government and others that will follow.
